

Boy accused of bullying

CRIME: Police say the "extreme" case involves 20 charges

A 12-year-old London boy faces 20 criminal charges in what police describe as an "extreme" case of bullying where he fired a pellet gun at two other boys dozens of times over a four-day period.

Police said the boy fired at two other boys, ages 11 and 13, shooting and hitting each several times with pellets and chasing them for blocks, until one of them complained to their parents.

The shooting began last Wednesday and continued until Saturday in and around Wharncliffe Road south near McKay Street.

On Saturday, police said the suspect hit the 13-year-old in the back of the head with the gun and punched the 11-year-old.

Police arrested and charged the 12-year-old suspect with seven counts of possession of a dangerous weapon, nine counts of assault with a weapon, two counts of threatening and two counts of criminal harassment.
